4 FIRST-AID MEASURES

GENERAL INFORMATION

NOTE! Effects may be delayed. Keep affected person under observation. NOTE! Keep affected person away from heat, sparks and flames!

INHALATION

SPILL CLEAN UP METHODS

Absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers. Small quantities may be flushed to drains with plenty of water.
